Re: Alabama Bicentennial Commission - NEW "Alabama Legacy" Spots

We have a new round of Bicentennial "Legacy" spots for you! As a reminder, celebrations and education about the state's history began in 2017 and will last until the end of 2019. We are substituting in new spots quarterly to keep it fresh!

This round of three spots features two amazing women and a fantastic musician!

- :30 Ruby Pickens Tartt was one of the foremost chroniclers of folklore, folk music and narratives of African Americans in rural Alabama. She helped to fill the manuscript and music collection of the Library of Congress. She was inducted into the Alabama Women's Hall of Fame in 1980
- :60 Harper Lee is the author of one of the most widely read books in American literature, *To Kill a Mockingbird*. She won the Pulitzer Prize in 1961 for the book which largely drew from her own experiences in her small hometown of Monroeville. Harper Lee received the Presidential Medal of Freedom in 2007 and was presented with the National Medal of Arts in 2010.
- :30 Erskine Hawkins, a Birmingham native, was a prominent African American trumpeter, band leader and composer during the "big band" era of the 1930s and '40s. His band was very popular dance in New York City. He recorded "Tuxedo Junction" with his band. Hawkins was inducted into the Alabama Music and Alabama Jazz Halls of Fame.
